OVERVIEW

Umer Akram Chaudhry is a seasoned dispute resolution lawyer. Qualified as an Attorney at Law in New York and as an Advocate of the High Court in Pakistan, he has practised for over 17 years across South Asia, Southeast Asia and the Middle East.

His practice is substantially cross-border. He has acted in international arbitrations seated in London, Singapore, New York, Geneva, Doha and Islamabad, under governing laws including English, New York, Swiss, Qatari and Pakistani law. He is regularly instructed by international clients—including US, European and Chinese companies—in cross-border disputes and in the recognition and enforcement of foreign arbitral awards in Pakistan, where he has acted in several of the leading reported decisions.

He represents contractors, employers and corporate clients, including state-owned enterprises, in construction, infrastructure and commercial disputes, and acts through the full life of a dispute: claims strategy, dispute board and adjudication proceedings, arbitration, litigation and enforcement. His current instructions include a construction arbitration in Doha under the QICCA Rules.

His approach to arbitration was shaped in Singapore, where he practised with Clyde & Co LLP and Rajah & Tann LLP in numerous international arbitrations, working on disputes across South and Southeast Asia and the Middle East.

Clients also retain him outside formal proceedings—to advise on issues arising during contractual performance and on risk mitigation, and to structure and negotiate complex settlements. He has served as a member of a dispute adjudication board in a US\$80 million power project dispute under a FIDIC-based EPC contract.

Umer holds an LL.M. from the University of California, Berkeley, which he attended as a Fulbright Scholar. He teaches international commercial arbitration and civil procedure as a member of the Adjunct Faculty at LUMS, and is co-author of the Pakistan Chapter of GAR Investment Treaty Know-How (Global Arbitration Review) and the Pakistan Chapter of the Global Arbitration Places Guide (Delos Dispute Resolution).
